Come to PCT and hop aboard the Carousel for a free harbour tour on Canada Day.

On Canada Day, PCT opens its doors for tours, displays, and entertainment as part of Golden Spike Days.

It's hard to miss the bright yellow piles while driving along the Barnet Highway. Do you know what this yellow product is? Where it comes from and where it goes? Do you know what is stored in the green tanks?

Find out this Canada Day. On Thursday, July 1st, Pacific Coast Terminals will be open to the public from 11am to 4pm. Bring your family and friends to this popular event and explore our terminal. This is your chance to take a closer look at our operations and meet our staff.

We have been an integral part of the community for 44 years and every few years we host an open house for our Port Moody neighbours. In 2001, almost 2,000 residents dropped by our community event.

Things to do at our Open House:

- Watch as sulphur is emptied from rail cars and transported to the large storage piles on site. Learn how the Rotary Car Dumper, the StakRake, the Shiploader and the Conveyor System work together to move more than 3.5 million tonnes of sulphur through the terminal each year.
- Cruise the Port Moody Inlet aboard the Carousel, and discover the hidden wonders of our harbour. From seals to rare shorebirds, Port Moody's working harbour is teeming with wildlife. Seating is limited, so be sure to pick up your free boat tickets at PCT as soon as you arrive.
